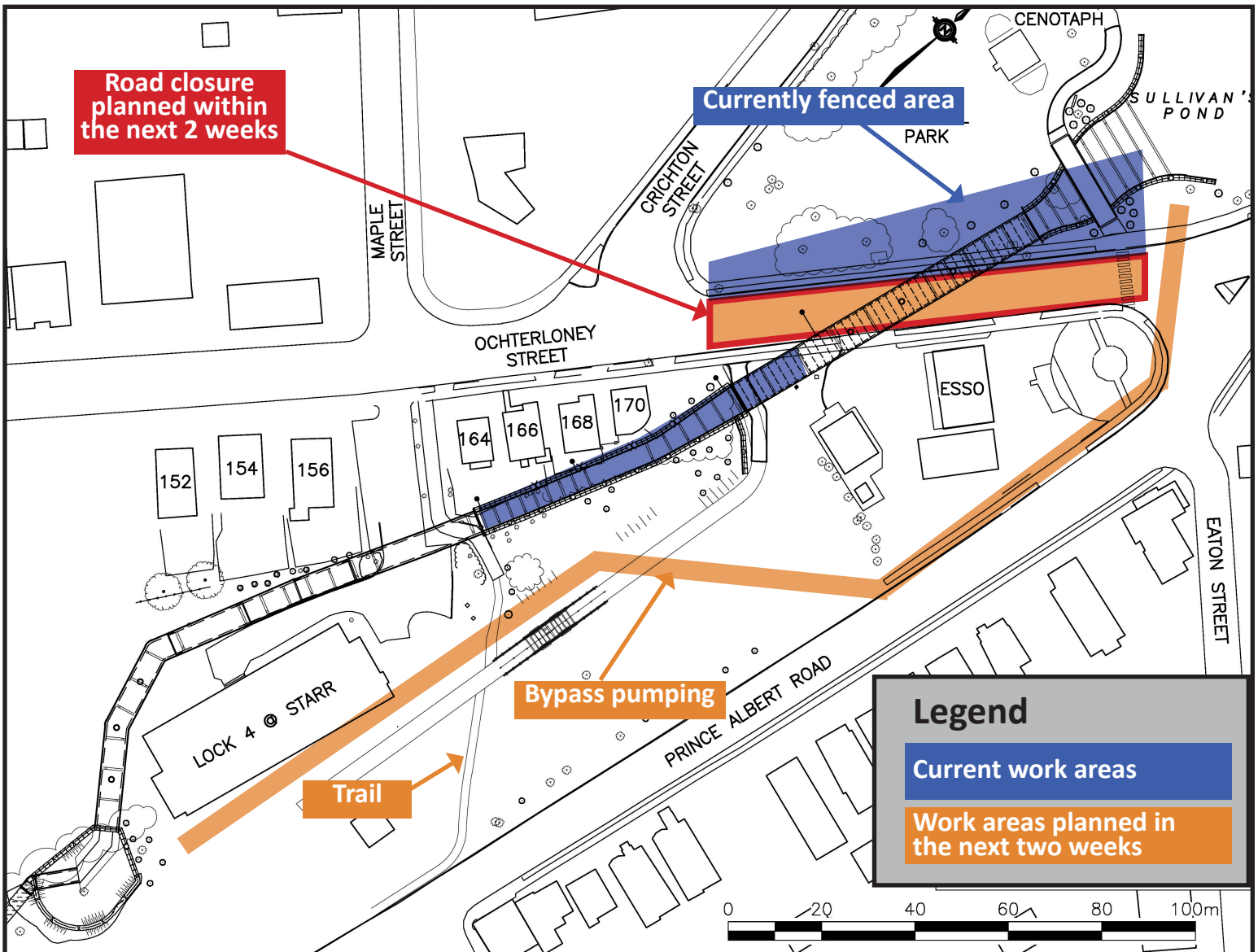


Project Background

The Sullivan's Pond Storm Sewer Replacement Project was initiated by Halifax Water as the existing underground pipe between the Pond and Halifax Harbour needs to be replaced. This engineering design project by CBCL Limited takes into account the more intense weather patterns and increased sea levels that climate change brings about. Dexter Construction will replace the old pipe with a box culvert that will add extra capacity to the system. The figure shown (below) shows the work currently taking place as well as work expected in upcoming weeks.

Current and Upcoming Work



Current work

- Safety fencing installed along the park side of Ochterloney Street
- Geotechnical and archaeological test pits are being dug
- Trees and shrubs are being removed but more will be planted at the end of the project
- Relocation of power poles
- Please note that the Esso sign has been replaced with a temporary one but that the station and store are open for business!

Upcoming work

- Road closure on Ochterloney Street between Crichton Avenue and Prince Albert Road is expected within 2 weeks.
- A cofferdam will be constructed at the outlet of Sullivan's Pond. Pumps installed in the pond will ensure that proper drainage of the pond and canal system still occurs around the work area.
- Pipes will be installed behind the Lock 4 building as shown on the previous page. No service interruptions are expected during this time. The trail will still be accessible.



- The driveway at the Lock4 Condominium building may be closed for a few hours in the next 2 weeks in order to allow for rerouting of utilities. Residents will be given notice before this work will take place as well as before any subsequent driveway closures.
