3. Old Business:	<u>Action</u>
a. Private land logging violation in <i>PWA</i> update (BG):	
• still before the courts:	
• BG updated the members on the logging operations that took place two years ago on private lands, which violated the <i>Bennery Lake Watershed Protected Water Area (PWA) Regulations;</i>	
• charges were laid to the landowner, a guilty plea was entered and accepted;	
 the penalties deliberated in court, work in Halifax Water's and its customers' favour; 	
• the Committee will be updated after the final decision is reached;	
Q: Were HRM bylaws violated as well as the <i>Bennery Lake Watershed PWA Regulations</i> ? (DM) A: No. (BG)	
• additionally, Halifax Water met with the logging company that did the cutting, seeking compensation for their actions as well;	
 an agreement was offered to the logging company that worked in Halifax Water's and its customers' favour; 	
• The Committee will be updated after a final decision is reached.	
Q : <i>Is there a third party?</i> (DM)	
A: Yes. Another party was caught up in the middle of the allegations. (BG)	
Questions from the previous October 18 Minutes regarding this case, requiring BG's confirmation (requested by DM):	
<i>Q</i> : What court did they go to? (JJ) A: Provincial Court. (BG)	
Q: If the landowner had followed protocol, could they have been able to do what they wanted to do? (JJ)	
A: Yes; the issue is not about harvesting in the watershed, per se, rather it is the cumulative effect of harvesting, risk management and to set the bar that violating <i>PWA</i> regulations will not be tolerated. (BG)	
Q: Whose land were they cutting on? (GO) A: Their own land. (BG)	
JJ arrived to the meeting which provided a quorum.	
b. PWA Signage update:	
 Three more signs need to be placed in the watershed area as follows: off highway 102, situated on the water supply plant access road gate; and two signs on separate trails that provide avenues for ATV traffic to travel through the watershed area; 	
• the two trail signs are not up yet because the contractor could not get them into the ground in time last fall;	
• AM revisited the sites with the contractor, who marked the sign locations yesterday;	

•	Need to do an underground utility infrastructure locate again because the 28 day timeframe is past, which is conducted through a third party locate company;	<u>Action</u>
	• the locate is for the water pipe lying next to the sign location.

•	 HO sent an email regarding the status of the <u>Waverley Game Sanctuary as</u> <u>defined under Section 113 of the <i>Wildlife Act</i></u>, which was read by AM: The Game Sanctuary exists; but within it, more stringent regulations may apply (e.g., <u>Wilderness Areas Protection Act</u>) with respect to the <i>Bennery</i> <i>Lake Nature Reserve</i> (see under b. below); you cannot hunt but you can fish in the Game Sanctuary; however, you can 	
	do neither in the Nature Reserve;	AM

•	among the reasons for this Nature Reserve is to protect a population of Michaux's dwarf birch, which grows on the margins of wetlands in only a few areas of NS.
